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PAPUA NEW GUINEA





I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Papua New Guinea perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *General Issues Facing Papua New Guinea*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results*
- *The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *Working with the World Bank Group*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Papua New Guinea*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

II. Methodology

From May to June 2017, 279 stakeholders of the WBG in Papua New Guinea were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the office of the President/Prime Minister, office of a Minister, office of a Parliamentarian, employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies, Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects or consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs, local government office or staff, bilateral/multilateral agencies, private sector organizations, private foundations, the financial sector/private banks, NGOs/community-based organizations, the media, independent government institutions, trade unions, faith-based groups, youth groups, academia/research institutes/think tanks, and the judiciary branch.

A total of 53 stakeholders participated in the survey (19% response rate). Respondents received an invitation via email and completed the questionnaire online.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the WBG's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.


The results of this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY '14 (response rate was 32%, N = 150). Unfortunately, the samples from FY14 and FY17 were quite disparate in terms of their representation of stakeholder groups and given the overall sample sizes, it would not be statistically sound to weight them to be more similar. Hence, changes in responding between FY14 and FY17 may be due to actual changes in the country, but it is also possible that these changes are due, in some part, to differences in the respondents. III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

- Because of the small sample size, respondents are grouped into “Government” (respondents from ministries, PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects, local government, and independent government institutions) and “Non-Government” (respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies, private sector, private foundations, financial sector/private banks, NGOs/CBOs, the media, and other organizations) categories for all further analyses.




“Which of the following best describes your current position? (Select only ONE response)”

Area of Primary Specialization




“Please identify the primary specialization of your work. (Select only ONE response)”


Geographic Locations

III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year’s Country Survey indicated statistically similar levels of familiarity with the WBG compared to respondents from the FY ‘14 Country Survey (mean rating = 5.9).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings of familiarity with the WBG (mean rating = 6.7) than respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 3.9).
- **Impact of Familiarity:** Respondents’ ratings of familiarity with the WBG were strongly, significantly correlated with their ratings of the WBG’s overall effectiveness in Papua New Guinea, and moderately, significantly, correlated with the extent to which the WBG’s work helps to achieve development results and the extent to which the WBG plays a relevant role in development in Papua New Guinea.




"How familiar are you with the work of the World Bank Group in Papua New Guinea?"

IV. General Issues Facing Papua New Guinea

Headed in the Right Direction

- **Year comparison:** A majority of respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that Papua New Guinea was headed in the right direction (percentage of respondents = 66%), with smaller numbers indicating that Papua New Guinea was headed in the wrong direction (11%) or that they were not sure (23%).




"In general, would you say that Papua New Guinea is headed in ...?"

Development Priority

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priorities in Papua New Guinea were education (percentage of respondents = 38%) and public sector governance/reform (37%), followed by transport (32%) and job creation/employment (27%).





Factors Contributing to Poverty Reduction

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that the area that would contribute most to poverty reduction in Papua New Guinea was job creation/employment (percentage of respondents = 37%), followed by education (29%), economic growth (26%), and rural development (26%).





Factors Contributing to “Shared Prosperity”

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY ‘14 Country Survey indicated that the areas that would best illustrate how “shared prosperity” would be achieved in Papua New Guinea were better entrepreneurial opportunities (percentage of respondents = 28%), better employment for young people (28%), and education and training that better ensure job opportunity (28%).





Global Climate Change




"In your view, is global climate change a very serious problem, somewhat serious, not too serious, or not a problem? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents chose from a list.)



V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group

Attributing Failed/Slow Reform Efforts

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that they attributed slow or failed WBG-assisted reform efforts to an inadequate level of capacity in government (percentage of respondents = 50%), the government working inefficiently (46%), and to an inadequate level of citizen/civil society participation (40%).

The World Bank Group’s Overall Effectiveness (*Indicator Question*)


- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year’s Country Survey gave statistically similar ratings for the WBG’s overall effectiveness in Papua New Guinea compared to respondents from the FY ‘14 Country Survey (mean rating = 6.6).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG’s overall effectiveness in Papua New Guinea (mean rating = 7.0) compared to respondents who are not collaborating (mean rating = 4.8).

Achieving Development Results (*Indicator Question*)

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year’s Country Survey gave statistically similar ratings for the extent to which the WBG achieves development results compared to respondents from the FY ‘14 Country Survey (mean rating = 6.6).
- **Stakeholders:** Government respondents gave significantly higher ratings for the extent to which the WBG achieves development results (mean rating = 7.5) compared to Non-Government respondents (mean rating = 5.9).

WBG Staff Preparedness


- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey gave statistically similar ratings for the WBG's staff being well prepared compared to respondents from the FY '14 Country Survey (mean rating = 6.8).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's staff being well prepared (mean rating = 7.1) compared to respondents who are not collaborating (mean rating = 5.1).

Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

- **Stakeholders:** Government respondents had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-six COS indicator questions compared to Non-Government respondents. Responses for individual indicator questions by stakeholder groups can be found in Appendix B (see page 55).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had a significantly higher mean rating for the aggregated responses to the twenty-six COS indicator questions (mean rating = 7.1) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.4). Responses for individual indicator questions by exposure to the WBG can be found in Appendix E (see page 80).




Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10

Greatest Value

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest values to Papua New Guinea were its capacity development (percentage of respondents = 39%) and strategy formulation (38%), followed by its financial resources (27%), policy advice, studies, analyses (24%), and technical assistance (23%).



Effectiveness of WBG's Instruments in Reducing Poverty




"How EFFECTIVE do you believe the following World Bank Group's instruments are in supporting the Papua New Guinea Government's efforts to reduce poverty?"

Greatest Weakness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest weakness in its work in Papua New Guinea was not enough public disclosure of its work (percentage of respondents = 27%). This was followed by respondents indicating that they didn't know (17%), WBG processes being too complex (15%), staff being too inaccessible (15%), being too bureaucratic in its operational policies and procedures (13%), and not exploring alternative policy options (13%).








"To what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's work and support help the poorest in Papua New Guinea? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents chose from a list.)

The World Bank Group's Work in Papua New Guinea

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG's work is aligned with their development priorities compared to respondents from the FY '14 Country Survey (mean rating = 6.5). However, respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of agreement that the WBG currently plays a relevant role in development in Papua New Guinea compared to respondents from the FY '14 Country Survey (mean rating = 7.0).





Overall Perceptions

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG's conditions on its lending are reasonable and that the WBG provides effective implementation support compared to respondents from the FY '14 Country Survey (mean ratings = 6.8 and 6.8, respectively).
- **Stakeholders:** Government respondents had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG disburses funds promptly (mean rating = 8.1) compared to Non-Government respondents (mean rating = 3.9).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG effectively monitors and evaluates its projects (mean rating = 8.0) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.6).

The WBG as an Effective Development Partner

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar ratings for the WBG as an effective development partner for all items that could be compared to respondents from the FY '14 Country Survey.
- **Stakeholders:** Government respondents gave higher ratings across all of these areas compared to Non-Government respondents, significantly so for 8 of the 15 items (see Appendix B, page 55).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher ratings for the WBG being inclusive (mean rating = 6.7) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 4.9).










"Overall, how would you rate the technical quality of the World Bank Group’s knowledge work and activities?" (1-"Very low technical quality", 10-"Very high technical quality")

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar ratings for the WBG's knowledge work and activities for all items that could be compared to respondents from the FY '14 Country Survey.
- **Stakeholders:** Government respondents gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's knowledge work being timely (mean rating = 7.5) and including an appropriate level of stakeholder involvement (mean rating = 7.3) compared to Non-Government respondents (mean ratings = 5.7 and 5.7, respectively).





- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of agreement that the WBG's financial instruments meet Papua New Guinea's needs compared to respondents from the FY '14 Country Survey (mean rating = 6.3).
- **Stakeholders:** Government respondents had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG's financial instruments meet Papua New Guinea's needs (mean rating = 7.5) compared to Non-Government respondents (mean rating = 5.8).




"The World Bank Groups's financial instruments meet the needs of Papua New Guinea."

Making the World Bank Group of Greater Value

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that, to make itself of greater value, the WBG should provide more adequate data/knowledge/statistics/figures on Papua New Guinea's economy (percentage of respondents = 33%), collaborate more effectively with Government clients (31%), and increase the level of capacity development in the country (30%), followed by reaching out more to groups outside of Government (18%).





- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that the WBG should collaborate more with the private sector (percentage of respondents = 30%) and NGOs (25%), followed by academia/think tanks/research institutes (22%), local government (19%), beneficiaries (19%), and the media (18%).





Where the World Bank Group Should Focus its Resources

- **Year comparison:** Respondents from the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that the WBG should focus its resources on public sector governance/reform (percentage of respondents = 33%) and education (32%), followed by health (24%), transport (17%), agricultural development (16%), poverty reduction (16%), job creation/employment (16%), anti-corruption (15%), economic growth (13%), and rural development (13%).





- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY ‘14 Country Survey indicated that they got most of their information about economic and social development issues from local newspapers (percentage of respondents = 76%), followed by the Internet (39%) social media (25%), and local television (18%).




"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Papua New Guinea (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey indicated that they preferred to get their information from the WBG in e-Newsletters (percentage of respondents = 46%), followed by the WBG's publications and other written materials (27%), the WBG's seminars/workshops/conferences (25%), social media (24%), the WBG's website (24%), and direct contact with the WBG (20%).




"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?




"Do you have reliable access to the Internet?"





- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had significantly higher rates of WBG website usage compared to respondents in the FY '14 Country Survey.




Internet Connection





Appendix D: Responses to Select Questions by Year²

Comparing responses across Country Surveys reflect changes in attitudes over time, but also changes in respondent samples and changes to the survey instrument itself. To reduce the influence of the latter factor, only those questions with similar response scales/options were analyzed. Unfortunately, the samples from FY14 and FY17 are quite disparate in terms of their representation of stakeholder groups and given the overall sample sizes, it would not be statistically sound to weight them to be more similar. Hence, changes in responding between FY14 and FY17 may be due to actual changes in the country, but it is also possible that these changes are due, in some part, to differences in the respondent samples.
