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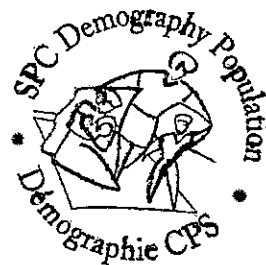

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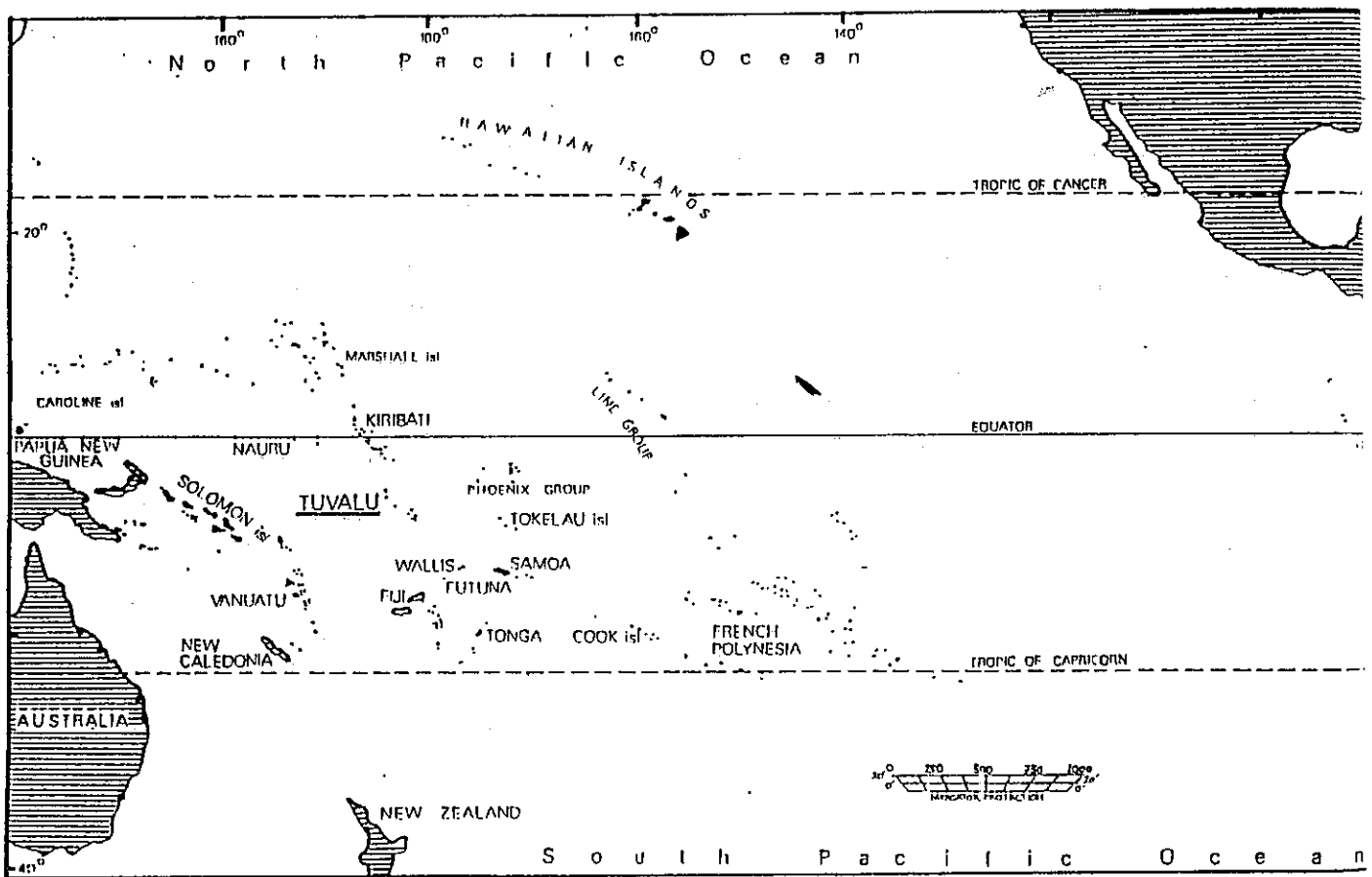
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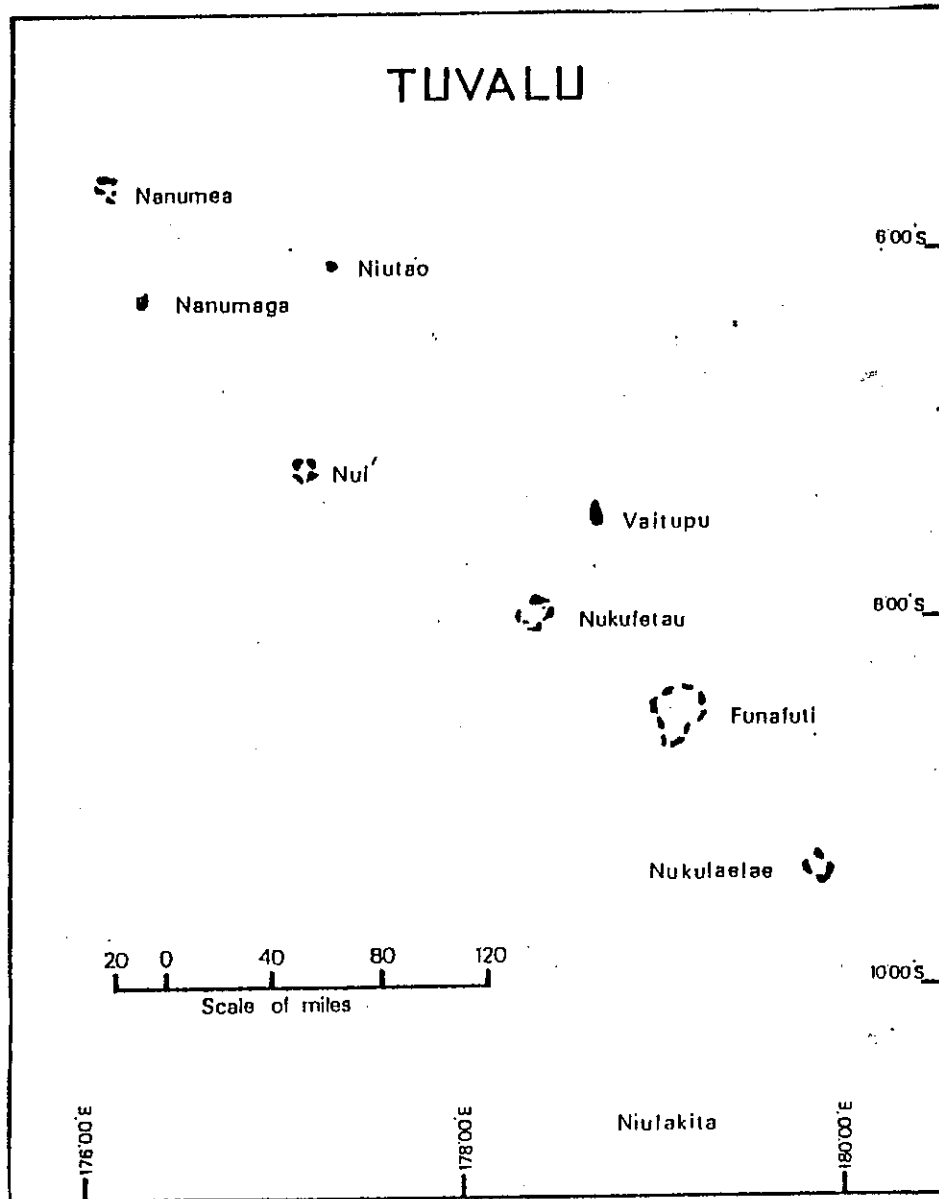

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

INTRODUCTION

An interval of just over 11 years elapsed between the 1979 and 1991 censuses which makes this vital exercise a little overdue. As a census of population is the largest single statistical operation a country is likely to undertake, periodic surveys of say 10 years apart is thought reasonable for meaningful development planning purposes. If 10 years between censuses is taken, as benchmark, a mini-census should follow immediately after 5 years of the previous census. This would make it possible for comparison of the available information in a fixed sequence.

The essential features of a census are individual enumeration, universality, simultaneity [the data obtained refer to the same reference time] and periodicity. A census can identify the characteristics not only of individuals, but also of families, households, employment, education, migrants, rural and urban populations, racial and religious groups.

Census data, like all survey data, are effected by the methods used to collect and compile them. How the census was taken and how the data were tabulated are important facts for data users to know. This report provides basic facts about the 1991 census: how the enumeration was done, what questions were asked, how the data were processed and difficulties faced during post and ante-enumeration periods.

DESIGN OF THE 1991 CENSUS

Planning for the 1991 de facto census began in October 1988 and the draft project proposal was finally signed by UNFPA representative and the Tuvalu Minister of Finance in August 1989.

Preliminary technical assistance was provided by a demographer from SPC who first visited Tuvalu in May 1991. The SPC consultant has been instrumental in the preparation of the training manuals for the field staff and the design and content of the household and personal questionnaires. His second visit later in the year saw him as a resource person for the training workshops.

All preparatory work for the census began in earnest on 3 December 1990 when the Census Commissioner was appointed to oversee the census operations. Her assistant was appointed some eight months later when the need to do so was felt.

The questionnaires final format and content were decided after a pre-test of the household and personal questionnaires were carried out by the Census Commissioner, Statistical Assistant and Trainee Statistician from the Agriculture Division in May 1991.

There was no time for elaborate mapping before the actual census started. The base maps we managed to produce with the intention to use them in the training of the field staff were of little use and had been totally ignored by the field staff on assignment.

Household listing was supposed to be undertaken during the mapping operation by supervisors before the training started. But this was not completed in time so the lists were compiled by the supervisors when they returned back to their respective islands.

The double round enumeration procedure was employed in the previous censuses but it was thought prudent to dispense with it this time merely due to financial constraints. There were no pilot tests taken in the outer islands as previously planned. A reorganization therefore was made to run the supervisors training and the pilot test back to back in Funafuti. The imminent shortage of time available and the fact that the pilot test was taken during the training course, there were no changes made to procedures and documents.

ENUMERATION

Census moment was midnight Sunday 17 November 1991 and enumeration week was from 18-22 November 1991. Units of enumeration for each island were determined based on population density and the number of households. Funafuti with the highest population figure has eleven enumeration areas [EAs] with Niulakita

with a resident population of 75 only has one person who acts as a supervisor and enumerator. One enumerator assigned to each EA and one supervisor for each island except Funafuti with two supervisors.

PUBLICITY

Publicity materials such as logo, hand written posters and T-shirts were made and distributed. Radio talks were also carried out by the Census Commissioner over Radio Tuvalu. The other means of publicity used was the Census Lottery whereby each household number was qualified to participate in and won money prizes. A total sum of A\$1000.00 was contributed by various Government Offices, SPC staff and individual officers for the census lottery. This tremendously and effectively set the minds of almost all the people in the country to be more interested in the census.

FIELDWORK

A total of ten supervisors and thirty six enumerators were recruited to undertake training in Funafuti, preparing them for the actual enumeration on 18-22 NOVEMBER 1991. Legal powers were given to them to carry out their duties, administrative instructions were written and all materials for the census were distributed to each one before returning back to their home islands. These materials were collected by the Census Head Office staff who visited all islands in December, 1991.

EDITING, CODING AND DATA PROCESSING

Manual editing was carried out by the staff of the Census Office in Funafuti. Eight coders were recruited for a four week period when a coding specialist from the Fiji Bureau of Statistics arrived in February 1992 to do the coding of the industries and occupations. Coders carried out a clerical edit and entered numeric codes on the questionnaires. However, the amount of coding on both the Household and Personal Schedules were limited since the questionnaires were designed to be self coded.

The codes were imputed to the computers when the SPC Data Processing Adviser, arrived on the 17 March 1992 for a two week consultancy. There were four data entry operators who worked on two shifts (morning and afternoon) under the supervision of the Adviser and assisted by the Statistical Assistant Officer. The two NEC microcomputers had been set up to automatically load the data entry system. The software package used for the processing of the Census data was the U-SP.

The procedure for data entry entailed entering a batch of questionnaires into the system in one session. A batch was equivalent to an Enumeration Area of approximately fifty (50) households. The data was entered once only as double entry of it for verification purposes was not necessary owing to the elaborate set of skips, range and consistency checks that ensure that the data was of a high standard. The questionnaires were entered in order of Household and Personal questionnaire numbers.

TABULATION

Final tables for the census were determined and based on the 1979 census of Tuvalu and Chuuk's 1989. These included such tables as population growth and density by island, population by sex and age groups, nationality, ethnicity, citizenship and education level. Most of the tables were produced in SPC Noumea and sent over to Tuvalu for checking by the census staff and final approval by the authorities.

ANALYSIS

The census report is in two parts. The first part is the administrative report with the basic tables. The second part is the analysis of the demographic characteristics. An expert demographer from the Australian National University, Australia is undertaking the analysis. This is the last activity of the project and it is expected to be completed by March or April 1993.

DIFFICULTIES AND CONSTRAINTS

Planning for the 1991 census began far too late, creating the usual hectic last minute haste or rush, often contributing to inadvertent oversight of some little thought of vital matters, usually taken for granted yet important overall to the success of the project. What is meant by this is that planning

should be followed by the methodological pretests, the user submission scheme, and topic evaluation to determine the content of the census.

Any large undertaking of this magnitude has always to be looked at with deep insight and foresight so that any impending problems be identified and overcome from the very beginning. This theory enforces the advantages of planning well in advance and putting one's house in order before anything else.

The first hurdle to be overcome in this vital project was to get suitable human resources to mastermind the whole operation. This was made possible through the technical and professional services of the UNFPA, SPC, New Zealand Department of Statistics, the Fiji Bureau of Statistics and the Australian National University. All contributed enormously to the success of the project as we can rightly witness it now in the production of this report.

Local staff equally made a concerted effort to implement the project to the best they could. It has to be noted with appreciation that a total of about 50 indigenous citizens of the country played active roles in fulfilling the objectives of this national project. About three-quarters of this total is female and the whole census organization is headed by a Census Commissioner who is also a female. Let us give a hearty pat to these females and cheer them, especially the Census Commissioner, for they have made history in Tuvalu.

The second demanding activity of the project was the timely procurement of the data processing equipments and stationery. We faced some difficulties in delivery of the items as they were all imported from abroad. Though, the equipments arrived later than planned, they were installed and made the work load a lot easier and quicker.

Internal transportation of local personnel to Funafuti for training and return to the outer islands imposed some problems too because the only inter-island cruiser, "Nivaga" 11 has a tight schedule. The resultant ills of this situation made its adverse impact when we only managed to return recruits back to 7 islands but not Niulakita. But with sheer luck, the MV "Manau" happened to make a coincidental trip south, enabling us to send on it the enumerator/supervisor for Niulakita.

Office space and furniture was yet another implication we faced but through alternative arrangements, census staff were given a cubicle of its own and with piecemeal supply of furniture the problems were finally remedied.

The data processing equipments ordered for the census were brand new, but with initial teething problems common to any new piece of equipment, we had recourse to use Tuvalu Church's Printery to complete several thousand questionnaire forms when our photocopier went out of action. We are therefore grateful to this kind gesture from the Ekalesia Kelisiano Tuvalu.

BUDGET

UNFPA agreed to provide A\$92,450.56 and Tuvalu Government A\$17990.00 making a total of A\$110,440.56 for preparation, census operation, purchase of data processing and office equipment and stationery, data processing and printing. UNFPA was very generous in providing a further grant of US\$31,394.63 for mission costs of technical consultancies.

EVALUATION

A postenumeration survey [reinterview] was conducted by the supervisors to estimate the coverage and content errors of the main census and was carried out immediately after enumeration. This was a 10 per cent cluster sample of the enumerated households.

There are omissions in any undertaking of this magnitude, one of them is error of closure. It is the difference between the population enumerated in the census and the expected population. The expected is the population enumerated in the previous census plus the intercensal births and arrivals from other countries, minus the intercensal deaths and departures to other countries.

Provided the data on intercensal births, deaths, arrivals, and departures are very accurate, the error of closure measures the difference between the unenumerated population in one census and the unenumerated population in another. Tuvalu's records on births and deaths are considered accurate and we have feelings of satisfaction on this score.

THE ENUMERATOR'S MANUAL

The Enumerator's Manual consisted of 314 paragraphs and each enumerator received copies in English. A two weeks' training based on the Manual was conducted explaining the whole manual by paragraphs and practice.

The first part of the manual explained the census organization, what the census was, why it was taken and the importance of the enumerator's role in the census operation. This was followed by detailed instructions on the best methods of going about the work to ensure that no person or household would be missed out or doubled counted and that the information collected would be accurate and not liable to misinterpretation.

The following paragraphs of the manual detail out in full only those parts which are relevant to the interpretation or evaluation of the tables.

THE HOUSEHOLD

21. Those persons who usually eat together food prepared for them in the same kitchen and who together share the work and cost of providing the food are called a household.
22. The household is the most convenient small group of persons for the purpose of the census and you will enumerate the population by household.
23. A household may consist of one or more persons who may or may not be related to each other and who may occupy a house or part of a house.
24. Very often a household will be a family living in a single dwelling.
25. If two or more groups of persons, each of which has its own separate cooking and eating arrangements, live in the same house treat them as separate households.
26. A domestic servant who eats with the household should be included with the household. If the servant cooks and eats separately he/she should be enumerated as living in a separate household.
27. In the same way a visitor or any of his/her children who eat with the household are counted as members of the household.
28. Sometimes groups of people live together but cannot be said to belong to a household. Ships crews and persons in hospitals, colleges and prisons are examples.
29. Supervisors will make arrangements for enumerating such people. Persons in institutions or on board ships should be treated as if belonged to a single household. The name of the institution or vessel should be written at the top of the questionnaire so as to make it clear that it is not a private household.
30. Those working in institutions but who live in their own households should be enumerated with their own households and not with the institution. Thus a nurse on night duty should be counted with her household and not with the patients in the hospital. This also applies to people who may sleep in a Maneapa on census night.
31. Enumeration of persons in hotels or guest houses will be the responsibility of Supervisors. Hotels/guest houses will be supplied with a stock of Personal questionnaires and envelopes. On the evening of census night, managers will give each guest a questionnaire and an envelope. All persons staying in the hotel on census night will be required to complete a questionnaire, seal it in the envelope and hand it to the Reception next morning. Envelopes with completed questionnaires will be collected by Supervisors from the Manager.

WHOM YOU SHOULD INTERVIEW?

32. You must interview as many persons as may be necessary to enable you to obtain particulars of all persons who are in the household on Census Night. See as many persons as possible.

WHOM YOU SHOULD ENUMERATE?

33. Enumerate all persons who were in the household on Census Night.
34. Sometimes there are persons who would normally have slept with the household but who were absent on census night and did not sleep in any other house. Examples are night fishermen, police officers and nurses on night duty, persons working a night shift in a hotel. Such persons are to be enumerated with the household. However, people who sleep in a Maneapa on census night should be enumerated with his or her household.

WHAT HAPPENS IF THERE IS NO ONE AT HOME

35. It may happen that when you visit a house that is inhabited you are unable to obtain any information, either because nobody is at home or because the adult occupants are away at the time.
36. You must enquire from those at home when is the best time to call back. If there is no one at home, ask the neighbours when the members of the household are likely to be at home and arrange your next visit for that time.
37. Try and send word ahead of you to say when you will be visiting households.
38. If after three visits you have not succeeded in finding anyone at home, make a note of the place and tell your Supervisor.
39. If you are told that a house is vacant and that no one is living there, you should write down "Vacant House", in your Field Record Book. In this case you should assign a Household questionnaire, complete any Identification details and mark "Vacant House" on the top of the questionnaire.

THE LABEL

44. You will be given a supply of self-adhesive labels. They are to be used to mark those households you have visited and whose occupants you have enumerated.
45. The purpose of the labels is to help ensure that no household is enumerated twice and that none is missed. It will also make checking easier.
46. When you have enumerated the household, write the household number on the label, detach it from its backing and fix it to the house. Place it where it will be easily seen, preferably on the main entrance door or on a post out of reach of small children. Explain that the label will peel off and that it is used for the purpose of the census only.
47. A label is to be fixed to a house only when a questionnaire has been completed in respect of its occupants. The number on the label must correspond with the household number on the questionnaire.

COMPLETING THE QUESTIONNAIRE

The Household Questionnaire

75. On the Household questionnaire, you will list the members of the household and complete information about the dwelling where the household sleeps. You will also record information about some of the economic activities of the household.

76. First enter the details on household identification on the top section of the questionnaire. These are: name of the Island, and Village, the Enumeration Area Number and the household number. You must also write in the date of the interview and your name. Most of the identification information should be available from the Census List.
77. The household number should be written in the Box provided. This number will usually correspond to the household number in the Census List. If the household is not on this Census List you will allocate this number yourself, using the next code number after the last one in the Census List.
78. The first household you enumerate will be 001, the second 002 and so on upwards.
79. Then complete the main body of the Household questionnaire.

The Personal Questionnaire

80. Next complete a PERSONAL Questionnaire for each person present in the household on census night. You must remember to complete a Personal Questionnaire for yourself. If your home is in your Enumeration area, count yourself in your own household. If not you should count yourself as a member of the household with whom you sleep on Census Night in your Enumeration area.
81. Enter the same identification information as in (No. 76) above- Island, and village on each Personal questionnaire.
82. Next enter the Household number and the Person number from the Household questionnaire in the boxes provided.
83. Then complete the main body of each Personal Questionnaire. If you come across people who say they have already been counted in another area ask them to tell you the place where they were enumerated. If you can verify that they have already been interviewed, you can leave them and go on to the next person. But you must write a note about them in your Field Record Book, and you must ask your supervisor what you should do about them.

ASKING THE QUESTIONS

84. The instructions which follow deal with what is required, and the way in which you are to ask the questions. It is your job to learn them and to ask them as they are set out in these instructions and on the questionnaire. It is important that each enumerator should ask the questions in exactly the same way, otherwise there will be misunderstanding and mistakes.
85. As far as possible, obtain information directly from the person concerned; however, for babies and young children you should obtain the information preferably from their parents.

The Household Questions:

86. Your first job is to make a list of all persons who were in the household on Census night, starting with the head of the household, if he or she was present, or with the person in charge of the household at that time.

Question 1- Name of Head of Household

87. Ask the head of the Household to tell you his/her full name. Print the name of the Head of the Household on the dots provided.

Question 2- Names of all persons who slept in the household on Census Night.

88. Ask, "Who stayed here on census night?"

89. It is important that you list the names in a set order so that you have a clear picture of the household from the very beginning.
90. List the members of the household by family.
- start with the head and his wife and unmarried children, beginning with the eldest and working down to the youngest,
 - then enter married children and their spouses and children,
 - then list other relatives and their wives and children who were in the household on census night,
 - finally list those who are not related to the head or anyone else in the household.
91. After the head of household, each person must have his or her relationship shown to a person higher up on the list.

92. Use terms such as brother, sister and mother only when you cannot use wife, son, or daughter to describe the relationship.
93. Do not use grandson, grand daughter, grandfather, grand mother, uncle, aunt, niece, nephew, cousin, unless necessary.
94. Very young children are sometimes forgotten, so pay particular attention to getting all babies counted. If the infant has no name write "Baby of -----" and enter the mother's person number.
95. Remember to enquire about and to include night workers.
96. When you have written the names of all who were in the household on census night, read over the list and ask,
- "Is that correct?"
If not, correct the list. Then ask,
- "Was there anyone else here on census night?"
If there was, include them.
96. Then look around you. If you see infants or children whose mothers are included, or very old or infirm people, ask further questions, "What about that child? Is he or she listed? Was that old man here on census night? Are there any night workers?" You must be sure that everyone who was present on census night is included, including visitors, friends, lodgers, servants or house girls.
97. A separate line is to be completed for each person in the household. You must first record the person's full name so that he or she may be easily identified by the supervisors checking your work.
98. If any usual member of the household was absent from the dwelling on census night and slept in another household on that night, you do not include him or her. This person should be enumerated in the place where he or she went to, so that you do not count this person twice in the census. But if a member of the household did not sleep in the dwelling because he/she was working (e.g gone fishing, or was on night shift)

then he/she should be included on the list. Persons who spend census night in a Maneapa must be included with his or her own household.

99. Enter the relationship. Write 'head' under the name of the head of the household. Then write the relationship of each person to the head or to his/her parents if they are present, or show the relationship husband/wife.
100. Relate children to their parents, if present, and husbands and wives, if present. In other cases relate persons to the head of the household.
101. Describe the relationship accurately. Be particularly careful to distinguish between children born of the parents and adopted or step children.
102. Where a man and a woman live together, although not married, you should treat them as man and wife if they regard themselves as such. The census is not concerned with the form of marriage.

103. The following relationships should cover all the cases with which the census is concerned:

Head	Wife	Husband
Son	Daughter	
Adopted son	Adopted daughter	
Father	Mother	

For all other relatives write "Relative". If a person is in none of these categories write "Other".

104. For persons in institutions it will be sufficient to write "Patient", "Prisoner" or as the case may be.
105. Where several persons who are not related are living in a household, name one as head and describe the rest as "Partner".
106. There are spaces for 14 persons on the household schedule. In cases where there are more than 14 persons in the household you have to use a second sheet, called a Household Continuation Sheet. In such cases you must tick the box

'Continuation Sheet used' on the front page of the main Household Questionnaire; fill in the proper identification information on the Continuation Sheet, and secure the two forms together.

107. Remember to write the information about the additional people on the pink Household Continuation Sheet, starting with person number 15.
108. At the same time as you write the person's name on the Household schedule, enter the sex of each person.

Ask, "Is this person Male or Female?" Write M for Males and F for Females.

109. Usually the person's sex will be clear to you from the name and relationship but if you don't know, ask. Never guess. Be particularly careful to get the sex of babies or infants right. Check that the sex you record is compatible with relationship- don't write "Male" for persons shown as wives or daughters, nor "Female" for persons shown as husbands or sons.

Question 3 - Total number of persons in the household on census night.

110. Ask the head to tell you the total number of males and females in his household who were present on census night. The total number of persons should be the same as the code number of the last person in the household list in question 2. If it is different, find out where the mistake has occurred, and correct any mistake.

Question 4- House and land ownership or tenure

111. This question asks for information about the ownership or the arrangements by which a household occupies its living quarters and land. Encircle the number beside the correct answer. If the answer is neither number 1, 2, 3, or 4, then you must encircle number 5 and also print the type of tenure on the dotted line.
112. Owning means that the household or a member of it owns the living quarters or land or is paying for them by installments or by some form of financing. No rent is paid, nor does the household occupy its quarters/land with someone else's permission
113. If the household pays no rent but does not own its living quarters/land, it either occupies them with an employer's permission, as in the case of living -in domestic servants, or in some other way.
114. If you cannot decide on the right tenure, or the arrangement by which the household occupies its quarters/land, encircle No. 5, and write any details give.

Questions 5, 6 and 7 - Materials used in constructing the dwelling

115. All you need to do is to find out what kind of materials were used in constructing the roof, outer walls and floor of the dwelling, and encircle the number that corresponds to the correct answer. If the answer is number 5 "OTHER", you must print the type of the materials used, in the space provided. If there are several kinds of materials, encircle the main one.

Question 8 - Type of kitchen

116. You must find out what type of kitchen the household has, and encircle the correct number . If the household has both traditional and European type kitchen, you must encircle number 3.

Question 9 - Type of toilet facilities

117. You must ask the head of the household about the kind of toilet that he has. There are five possible answers. If the people do not know the type of toilet they use, go and see for yourself. For any toilet not covered by numbers 1, 2, 3 and 5, encircle number 4 and print the details.

Question 10 - Main source of drinking water

118. You must ask about the household's main source or supply of drinking water, or the supply on which the household mainly relies- for most of the time. Encircle only one answer. If the household's supply of drinking water comes from "OTHER" source, (No.5) print the details.

Questions 11 and 12 - Main fuel used for cooking and lighting.

119. You must ask the head of the household about the main fuel he uses for cooking and lighting. Encircle only one number as the answer. If the answer is "OTHER", then you must print the details.

Question 13 - Household amenities or facilities

120. In this question you will find out about some of the amenities or facilities that the household may have. There are 15 items on the list; you must ask about each in turn, following the order on the questionnaire. Encircle only those which are available to the household and are in proper working order.

Questions 14 to 17 - Household economic activities

121. These questions ascertain the kind of economic activities that household members are engaged in, and how many males and females in the household are engaged in these activities. It is possible for a

household to be engaged in more than one type of fishing, land work, housework or handicraft. You must encircle all those activities which the household members perform.

For example if the household members are engaged in OCEAN and also LAGOON fishing (Question 14), you must encircle numbers 1 and 2. You must then write in the boxes how many males and females are involved in OCEAN and LAGOON fishing. If, for example, two males and no female do OCEAN fishing, you will write "2" in the box for male and "0" in the box for female. Similarly, you will fill in the box that corresponds to Lagoon fishing writing in the number of males and females who are actively involved in Lagoon fishing.

122. If there are "OTHER" categories not specified in questions 15 and 17 then you must print the details in the space shown.

Question 18- Sale of household produce

123. In this question you must find out whether any members of the household sold goods, produce, or cooked food to anyone during the week before your visit. Explain that you are talking about the seven days that ended yesterday. Read out the products one by one and record the answer by encircling No. 1 or No 2. When you finish ask if there were any other products sold by the household, and if so, write them down in "OTHER (No 11).

Question 19 - Sources of household cash income

124. This question helps to identify the usual sources of household cash income and the number and sex of persons in the household who contribute such income.
125. You must read out the categories to the head of the household, one by one, and record all the sources of cash income by encircling the appropriate number or numbers. Then ask about the number and sex of the persons bringing in the cash income, recording this information in the boxes provided.
126. Ask if there are any other sources of cash income, and if so, write the information in "OTHER SOURCES", and encircle No. 6.

Question 20 - Livestock owned

127. You must ask the head of the household if he or she owns any livestock (chicken, ducks and pigs). If the answer is "YES", you must record the number of each type of growers (young livestock), and adult livestock in the Boxes provided. For Adult livestock you must also enter the number of males and females owned.

Questions 21 to 23 - Remittances

128. These 3 questions ask for information on whether the household receives remittances, and if so, where the remittances come from, and how regularly they are received. We are not interested in the amount.
129. If the household does not receive any remittance you must end the household interview at question 21, encircling the No. 2. You will then proceed to fill in the Personal questionnaire.
130. If the household receives remittances you should encircle No. 1 in question 21, and then ask question 22, followed by question 23.
131. It is possible that a household may receive remittances from both within and outside Neighbors. In this case you should encircle both Nos. 1 and 2 in question 22.
132. For those households which received remittances you must find out how often the remittances are received, and encircle only one number in question 23. In cases where a household has not receive remittances at

least once in the last year you should encircle number 6 (OCCASIONALLY) in question 23.

133. You have completed the Household questionnaire. Now check that

- * all necessary questions have been completed
- * others can read what you have written
- * the information you have recorded agrees with item
- * any Continuation Sheet is firmly stapled with the main Household Questionnaire

134. If you find things have gone wrong or that there are mistakes or omissions put them right.

135. When you are satisfied that the Household particulars are correctly recorded go on to completing a Personal questionnaire for each person on the household form, including those on any Household Continuation Sheet

THE PERSONAL QUESTIONNAIRE

136. A Personal Questionnaire must be completed for every male and female present in Neighbors on Census night. This includes babies, old people, school children, prisoners, sailors, hospital patients, and tourists and other visitors in Neighbors. It also includes you, the enumerator. It does not include Tuvaluans who are overseas at the time of the census.

137. You must complete a Personal Questionnaire for every person that you find in each household on census night. Normally, this will be done by interviewing the person concerned. You should always ask to speak to the person himself or herself and not obtain the information about him/her from other people.

138. However, in the case of babies and young children you will have to talk to the mother or father. If you come across twin-babies, fill up two separate questionnaires.

139. And if a person is sick or away from the house when you call you may have to find out about him/her from the head of the household.

140. The Personal Questionnaire takes quite a long time to complete so you must not waste any time in conducting the interview. Otherwise, the people to whom you are speaking may become bored or tired, and will not answer the questions properly.

141. You do not have to go through the entire form with everybody. For example, a tourist only goes to Question 31. A child under 6 years answers up to question 39. All males stop at Question 49.

142. You should interview each person in the order that you wrote down on Page 1 of the Household Questionnaire. Start off with the head of the household.

143. Complete the top part of the Questionnaire first; this will be exactly the same as on the front page of the completed Household Questionnaire, except that there is an extra box to record the person's own code number. This number is obtained by looking through the list of persons you wrote down on the front page of the Household Questionnaire.

144. A person's own code number must have 2 digits. The head of the household will be Person No. 01

Question 24 - Name of Person

145. Print the full name of the person you are collecting information about. If you know it already, don't ask for it again. Remember that you only want to know the names because it will make it easier for other people to check your work later on. It is the person's code number, not his/her name, that is entered into the computer.

Question 25 - Relationship to head of household

146. Now ask the person what his or her relationship is to the head of the household, and encircle the appropriate number.
147. Remember to check the person's answer with what you have already written down under Question 2 of the Household Questionnaire.
148. Separate adopted son and adopted daughter from own children of the head.

Question 26 - Sex

149. Ask: "Is this person male or female". Simply record whether a person is male (encircle No. 1) or female (encircle No. 2)
150. Usually the person's sex will be clear to you from the name and relationship but if you do not know, ask. Never guess. Be particularly careful to get the sex of babies and infants right. Check that the sex you record is compatible with relationship, and that you record the same sex on both the Household and Personal Questionnaires for the same individual.

Question 27 - Marital Status

151. Ask: "Is this person married?"
152. For persons who have never been married, including children, encircle No. 1 (Never Married).
153. People living together as man and wife should be shown as married whether or not they have been through any civil or religious ceremonies. The census is not concerned with who is legally married and who is not. Accept the answer as it is given to you.
154. Separated or divorced is for a person who has been married but who had divorced or separated and is living as such at the time of the census.
155. Widowed is for a person, male or female, who has been married but whose spouse has died and who has not remarried at the time of the census.

Question 28 - Date of birth

156. Ask: "When was this person born?"
Write the day, month and year of birth.
157. You must try particularly hard to get at least the month and the year of birth. If the month cannot be given, be satisfied with the year of birth.
158. This question is one of the most important questions in the census and it may be the most difficult to answer. You may find many people who do not know their date of birth. In these cases you will have to estimate their ages.
159. The best source of information will be birth or baptismal certificates and some families have other records in which birth dates are recorded. Ask to see any documents which are available.
160. Some people may not know their date of birth but may know their age. Ask, "How old is this person?". Write the age given in the Box provided for "AGE". This should be the age of the person at his or her last birthday.
161. If a person does not know his or age, or if he is clearly guessing, you will have to help him. Many old people tend to "round off" their age to the nearest 10 years, and say that they are "60" or "70" or "80". It is your job to get a more accurate figure. One of the best ways is to make use of the historical calendar for your area.

162. When using a historical calendar, ask the person whether he or she remembers a particular event, and how old they were then. Then try him or her out on other events to obtain the most accurate estimate of the person's age. You will be taught how to estimate ages using a historical calendar of Neighbors.
163. If you don't find the historical calendar very helpful, there are other ways of estimating people's ages. For example, you can ask an old man to compare his age with that of another old person whose age you already know. Find out which of them was born first and what is the approximate difference in age. Then choose another person and make an age comparison in the same way. Eventually you will have a rough estimate of the old man's age.
164. In the same way one reliable birthdate in the household may help you to work out the ages of other members of the household if it is known whether they are younger or older and by how many years.
165. If all else fails, make the best estimate you can, judging by such things as the persons's appearance and position in the household and by using your common sense knowledge that parents are seldom younger than sixteen years of age when their first child is born; that women do not usually bear children below the age of twelve or over fifty years; that people who were in the same class at school are generally closely similar in age and so on.
166. Record the date of birth in Question 28 by entering numbers in the boxes provided. If an exact date of birth is given there is no need to complete the "AGE" Box in question 28.
167. If you cannot get the date of birth leave the Boxes (for date of birth) empty and record the person's age in the Box for "AGE".

Question 29 - Ethnic group

168. Ask: "What ethnic group does this person belong to?"
List the various categories- Tuvaluan, Part Tuvaluan, I- Kiribati, European or Other etc.
169. Remember that ethnic group refers to a person's physical and cultural features (skin colour, hair texture, language, customs etc.) and not to his country of citizenship.
170. Record the group or race to which the person considers he or she belongs. If there is any doubt as to the person's racial origin, record the father's.

Tuvaluan: This is the ethnic group of the indigenous people of Neighbors, and it will be the most common type you come across.

Part-Tuvaluan: If a person is partly Tuvaluan, and partly of another race, encircle No. 2. Such a person may have a Tuvaluan mother and a European or I-Kiribati father, or a non-Tuvaluan mother and a Tuvaluan father, or a Tuvaluan grandfather. Anyone who claims to have some Tuvaluan "blood" should be put in this category.

I-Kiribati: This is the ethnic group of the indigenous people of Kiribati.

European: This term covers all "white" people from countries in Europe like England, France, Germany, Italy, and Spain. It also includes people of European ancestry who have settled in Australia, New Zealand, U.S.A. and Canada. For all such people you should encircle No. 4.

Other: For all other ethnic groups, encircle No. 5, and print the ethnic group of the person in the space provided. Names such as "Indian", "Japanese", "Chinese", "Filipino", "African" will appear here. Black people from U.S.A. and the Caribbean are usually classed as "African". People of Melanesian ancestry who are from Fiji, Solomon Islands, Papua New Guinea or New Caledonia should be classed as

"Melanesian". People of Micronesian ancestry from Nauru, Marshall Islands, Guam, Palau and the Federated States of Micronesia should be classed as "Micronesian". People of Polynesian ancestry from Tonga, Cook Islands, Samoa, and New Zealand (Maoris) should be classed as "Polynesian".

171. If you are not sure about the ethnic group, encircle No. 5 and write down what the person tells you. Check with your Supervisor later on.

Question 30 - Citizenship

172. A person's citizenship (or nationality) refers to the country where he or she has a permanent right to live. It means the country of which he/she is a citizen. It is shown by a person's passport, if he has one. It does not mean the same as Ethnic group, or race, which refers to a person's physical or cultural features.
173. Ask: "Is this person a Tuvaluan citizen?" If the answer is 'yes', encircle No. 1.
174. If the person is not a Tuvaluan citizen, ask him/her to tell you the name of his/her country of citizenship, or nationality. If the person is not sure, ask him/her what kind of passport he/she is holding.
175. If the person is I-Kiribati, encircle No. 2. If the person is of any other nationality encircle No. 3, and print the person's nationality or country of citizenship in the space provided.
176. You may come across a person who is a citizen of two countries such as U.K and Australia. In this case, ask where the person intends to settle permanently, and record him as a citizen of that country.

Question 31 - Where do you usually live?

177. In this question, you will ask the person where he or she usually lives. Print the name of the Village and Island in the space provided. You are not trying to find out his Home Island, because you will ask this in Question 37.
178. If someone is a visitor in the household for over 3 months or intends to stay with the household for more than 3 months then the place he is visiting should be treated as the place where he usually lives. If the visit is less than 3 months, treat him as not usually living with the household. However, you must find out where he usually lives. If he tells you the name of another Village/Island in Neighbors then print the details.
179. A school-child usually at boarding school but staying with his family for the school holiday should be treated as usually living with his family. A school-child staying with another family in order to attend school in their area should be treated as usually living with that family.
180. If the person tells you he lives in another country, print the country's name in the space provided. In this case you must not fill in any details about the village or Island. You must also end the interview here at Question 31 if the person tells you he usually lives in another country. This would include all visitors and tourists to Neighbors. Be sure to thank them for their help.

Question 32 - Where living one year ago i.e in November 1990.

181. Ask, "Where was this person living one year ago, i.e in November 1990?"
182. For persons who were living in Neighbors write first the name of the name of the Island . (Write the name of the Island where the person lived and worked in November 1990).

183. A person who may have been away from home temporarily should be shown where he or she normally lived in 1990.
184. If the person changed residence in November 1990, record the place where he or she was living on 1st November 1990.
185. For persons who were living outside Neighbors write the name of the country only.
186. For persons who were born after 1st November 1990 put a tick in the Box alongside "NOT BORN YET".
187. It is necessary to make enquiry for each member of the household. Do not assume that all members of the household lived in the same place one year ago- members may have been separated for schooling or work, and others may have joined the household on marriage, widowhood, adoption or for other reasons.

Question 33 - Where living at time of Independence, October 1978.

188. Ask: "Where was this living at the time of Neighbors's Independence i.e. in October 1978?"
189. For most people, this was such an important event that they will easily remember where they were. Be sure to ask for the Island where they were usually living - not for the place where they attended Independence Day celebrations.
190. It is necessary to make enquiry for each member of the household. Do not assume that all members of the household lived in the same place at Independence (1978)- members may have been separated for schooling or work, and others may have joined the household on marriage, widowhood, adoption or for other reasons.
191. For persons who were living in Neighbors record the name of the Island where they were usually living.
192. A person who may have been away from home temporarily should be shown where he or she normally lived in October 1978.
193. If the person changed residence in October 1978, record the place where he or she was living on Independence day (1st October 1978).
194. Overseas visitors and people who have come to live in Neighbors since Independence will need to be reminded that Independence Day was on 1st October 1978.
195. For persons who were living outside Neighbors write the name of the country only.
196. For persons who were born after Independence Day (1st October 1978) tick the Box alongside "NOT BORN YET".

Question 34 - Real father alive?

197. Ask: "Is this person's real father alive?"
198. Encircle the appropriate answer, No. "1" or No. "2", in respect of the person's natural father. (Not a father who may have adopted the person being enumerated).

Question 35 - Real mother alive?

199. Ask: "Is this person's real mother alive?"
200. Encircle the appropriate answer, No. "1" or No. "2", in respect of the person's real mother, that is the woman who bore him/her. (Not a mother who may have adopted the person being enumerated).

201. If the person's real mother is alive, ask:
"Was this person's mother in the household on census night?"
202. If the answer is 'Yes' and the person's real mother was present in the household write the mother's person number (shown on the Household Questionnaire) in the box provided. (If, for example, the person's real mother was present and she is listed on the Household Questionnaire as Person Number "02", write her person number in the Box provided. The aim of this question is to link 'mothers' and their 'own children' by person number in one household.
203. If the person's mother was not in the household on census night, but was somewhere else or dead, do not enter anything in the Box.

Question 36 - Place of Birth or Where were you born

204. Ask: "Where was this person's mother living when he or she was born?"
205. Here you will find out the person's place of birth. However, the question is asked in this way because we wish to know the mother's usual place of residence at the time, and not the location of the hospital in which she may have borne the person.
206. If the person was born in Neighbors write first the name of the Village, then the name of the Island in which that village is located.
207. If the person was born outside Neighbors write the name of the country only - for example, Kiribati, Fiji, England, Australia, Tonga etc.

Question 37 - Home Island

208. Ask: "Which is your home island?"
209. You need only ask this question if the person is Tuvaluan or Part Tuvaluan. For all other persons go to the next question.)
210. Ask where the person's home island is . This may be difficult for people who live in Funafuti, or people whose mother and father come from different islands. All you really want to know is the person's own view or own opinion about which is his home island.
211. Encircle only one of the 9 possible answers.

Question 38 - Religion

212. Ask: "What is this person's religion?"
213. This is the only question in the census which people are not compelled to answer. There are eight possible answers. The main Christian Denominations in Neighbors are listed as Nos. 1 to 5 - Congregational, Seventh Day Adventist, Jehovah's Witness, Roman Catholic and Bahai. For most people you will encircle one of these numbers.
214. For all other religious groups encircle No. 6, and print the name given. Examples of these include- Muslim, Hindu, Anglican etc.
215. If a person refuses to state a religion or objects to doing so encircle No. 7 (REFUSED).
216. If a person says he has no religion, or he does not believe in God, encircle No. 8 (NONE).

Question 39 - School Attendance

217. Ask: "Is this person attending school this year?"
218. A person is either:
- * Too young (i.e less than 6 years old/born in 1985 or after)
 - * Attending school (at school this year)

- * Left school
- * Never attended school (never been to school).

219. Encircle only one answer.

220. "School" in this case means any primary or secondary educational institution providing teaching on a full-time basis. It can be a Government or a private (eg. Church) school in Neighbors or overseas.

221. FOR ALL CHILDREN UNDER 6 YEARS OLD (WHO ARE TOO YOUNG TO ATTEND SCHOOL ENCIRCLE NO. 1 AND CLOSE THE INTERVIEW AT THIS POINT.

222. If the person is 6 years and over is currently attending school and will be re-starting school (after the school holidays) encircle No. 2.

223. If the person is 6 years and over and has finished or left school encircle No. 3.

224. If the person is 6 years and over and has never been to school, encircle No.4.

Question 40 - Able to read a Bible or newspaper

225. Ask: "Can this person read a bible or a newspaper?"

226. Persons who can read in any language either the Bible or newspaper or similar kind of written material without any difficulty would be considered as literate, and you should encircle No. 1 (YES).

227. Encircle No. 2 (NO) if the person cannot read.

Question 41 - Educational attainment.

228. Ask: "What is the highest level of education this person has completed?"

229. Write in the box provided the highest class or form the person reached, or has completed if still at school. For example if a person attended only Primary School and left after class 6, encircle No. 1 and then write the 2 digit number "06" in the box beside "PRIMARY". If the person went on to secondary school up to Form 5, encircle No. 2 and print "05" in the box beside "SECONDARY". You must make sure you write in the details for Primary school for all those who have been to secondary schools.

230. If the person has been to secondary school, has left secondary school and has some other post-secondary training (College, University, Marine/Catering/Nursing school,etc) write the name of the Institution and the years of studies/training completed beside the category "TERTIARY". If the person attended several post-secondary tertiary institutions, enter the one the person considers most important.

231. The following is a list of some of the tertiary institutions found in the Pacific area:

- * Teacher's Training College, Kiribati
- * University of the South Pacific
- * University of Papua New Guinea
- * Fiji School of Medicine
- * Agricultural College, Western Samoa,
- * Forestry Training School, Fiji
- * School of Catering, Tahiti
- * Teacher's College, P.N.G
- * Fiji Institute of Technology (F.I.T)
- * Technical Institute, Solomon Islands.

232. For a person who has completed primary school, done 4 years at Neighbors Secondary School, and finished a bookkeeping course at Solomon Island's Technical Institute, you would record the information like this:

233. If the person attended an informal or unrecognized school outside the primary/secondary system, such as Bible School, write the name of the Institution/Years attended beside the category "OTHER" and encircle No 4.

234. If the person has never attended school, encircle No. 5.

Question 42 - Highest educational qualification

235. Always ask this question to the person directly. Do not rely on other people to give you the information about a person's qualification, because they won't usually be able to give you the details.
236. A qualification is always shown by a certificate, and if possible, you should ask to see this certificate.
237. Ask "What is the highest educational qualification this person has obtained?"
238. Encircle the number showing the highest qualification or certificate, diploma, or degree the person has obtained. If the answer is either number "7" or "8" or "9" or "10" you must write out what the actual qualification is. eg. No. "7" Certificate in Teaching, No. "8" Diploma in Agriculture, No. "9" BA (Economics).
239. If the person has no qualification at all, encircle No 1.
240. If there are any other qualifications not covered in Nos. 2 to 9, encircle No 10 (OTHER) and write the qualification in the space provided.
241. FOR ALL CHILDREN UNDER 10 YEARS, YOU SHOULD STOP THE INTERVIEW AT THIS POINT. FOR ALL OTHERS, GO ON TO QUESTION 43. THE NEXT SET OF QUESTIONS, 43-48, REFER TO ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, OR WORK THAT PEOPLE DO IN ORDER TO MEET THEIR NEEDS, FOR FOOD, SHELTER AND MONEY.

Question 43 - What is this person's usual work

242. Ask: "What is this person's usual OCCUPATION?"
243. This means the kind of work that he/she has been doing for most of the last year. There are 10 possible answers. Read out the first nine and ask him/her to choose the one in which he/she spends most of his/her time. The question applies to women as well as men.
244. You must be ready to tell the person more about each of the categories in order to help him/her choose the correct one. Anyone who was active, in any way, in providing for themselves or the household worked. It does not matter whether they had a job or were paid for what they did. A person who fished, or cut copra or looked after pigs, or replaced thatch on a roof or made baskets, or did housework worked. So did a person who was in paid employment.

245. When you are satisfied with the answer, encircle one of the numbers from No. 1 to No. 7.

1. Paid Work/Work in Family Business:

If a person has paid work, he/she earns money in his/her job. He or she must:

- * work for the Government
- * work for a private business, an individual or a mission
- * runs his/her own business

In rural areas and outer islands, you should include the following people in this category: storekeepers, teachers, nurses, Executive Officers, policemen, radio operators etc.

If someone works in a family business he or she does not receive regular wages. Very often they work in a family business or farm and are members of the family who are provided with food and lodging and share in the benefits of any profits which arise from the joint family work but do not receive cash on a regular basis.

Fishermen or farmers who get money by selling their own produce should be in No. 2.

2. Fishing/Farming/Making Handicraft for sale and money:

This category includes anyone who works by catching fish, growing crops, keeping livestock (pigs, poultry), or making any kind of handicraft for sale and money. In other words you will include anyone who worked on his/her own account fishing, growing, making or selling things for money.

A woman who spends most of her time in making handicraft, or in collection, for sale should be included here, even though she also does housework.

3. Fishing/Farming/Making Handicrafts for subsistence only:

This category includes anyone who works by catching fish, growing crops, keeping livestock, or making handicraft/thatch mainly for their own family use. Such a person may also sell some produce, but they are not mainly working to sell produce for cash.

A woman who spends most of her time in making handicraft, or in collection, for her family use should be included here, even though she also does housework.

4. Housework:

This refers to people who spend most of their time occupied with purely domestic duties round the house, such as cleaning, washing, cooking, caring for children and looking after sick or old relatives. They are not paid.

Many housewives for example combine domestic duties with other work-making handicraft, sea collection, fishing etc. You must decide on which activity the person spends most time and encircle the appropriate category. Women who spend most of their time fishing or making handicraft should not be included in the "housework" category.

5. Student:

Encircle this number for any young person who is attending school, or a training course or a University full time. Full time students may be on holiday at the time of the census and some may have worked but for the purposes of the Census such people should be entered in No. 5. (Student).

6. Too Old:

Encircle this number (No. 6) if the person does not do any work at all for most of the time because he/she is too old or retired. In Neighbors the retirement age is 50 years.

If an old or retired person still works for money or to provide for himself or his family he/she should be shown under No. 1 or No. 2 or No. 3 as appropriate.

Old people who are still active in housework should be classified in No. 4.

7. Other

If the usual activity of the person is not shown in Nos. 1 to 6, encircle No. 7, and record the details or the reason why this person is not included in the above categories.

For example, the person may be:

- UNEMPLOYED
- DISABLED OR HANDICAPPED
- SICK FOR A LONG TIME (PATIENT)
- DOING VOLUNTARY WORK

Question 44 - Type of Work Last Week

246. Now you will ask whether the person did any work at all during the last week. Say that you are talking about the seven days that finished yesterday.
247. "Work" means that the person spent at least one hour working last week.
248. A person either worked last week or did not. Anyone who was active last week, in any way, in providing for themselves or the household worked. It does not matter whether they had a paid job or were paid for what they did. A person who fished, cut copra, replaced thatch on a roof, made handicraft or cultivated a vegetable garden worked, or did housework worked.
249. If the person says that he or she did work last week, encircle No. 1 ("YES").
250. If the person says that he/she did not work last week, encircle No. 2 ("NO") and jump to question 48.
251. If a person says that he or she did not work, check again. People doing housework or subsistence work will often say that they did not work last week. What they mean is that they did not work for money. You may have to remind them that cooking, washing, caring for children, making mats or baskets or collecting firewood or shell fish is really working.
252. If a child or young person only did full-time studies/training during the previous week, you should treat them as not working (No 2). But if he/she also did more than one hour's work in the house or outside the house (eg fishing), you should treat them as working (No. 1).

Question 45 - Work for Wages, Profit or in Family Business Last Week

253. For those who did work last week, you will ask them whether he/she did work for wages, for profit or in a family business.
254. Work for Wages: Refer to people who are employed and are paid regularly in cash. A wage earner is paid on an hourly, daily, weekly or fortnightly basis. This category also included salary earner, whose pay is assessed on an annual basis, and paid often on a monthly basis.

Work for Profit: Refer to persons who sell something or some service. They are self employed and do not receive a wage or a salary.

A person who runs his/her own shop is paid for each article sold.

Work in a Family Business: Such people work but do not receive regular wages. Very often they work in a family business or farm and are members of the family who are provided with food and lodging and share in the benefits of any profits which arise from the joint family work but do not receive cash on a regular basis.

255. If the person answers "YES", encircle No 1.
256. Ask: "What kind of work was it?"
257. Find out more about the kind of work and enter the details in the space provided. We require an exact description of the Work the person did. It is sometimes difficult to get an exact answer but you should always aim to provide a two or three word description of the person's job.
258. A vague single word description is not enough. Avoid general terms such as 'manager', 'clerk', 'mechanic', 'foreman', 'teacher', 'operator' or 'labourer'. Record exactly what a person did- for example "sales manager", "typist clerk", "motor mechanic", "foreman carpenter", "primary school teacher", "forklift operator", "stevedore".
259. You will find it best to speak to the person concerned whenever possible. Members of the household are often vague as to the occupations of others.
260. You may find that you get a more accurate idea of his/her job by asking for the job title and recording that.
261. A person may have done more than one kind of job last week. In such a case you should record his main job- the one he spends most time at - that which he usually does.
262. You have described the person's own job, which is his occupation. We have next to consider the kind of business, product or service produced by the worker and his/her fellow workers. For example a person may be a typist working in a mining company, in a hotel, for a commercial bank or for the government. The person's occupation is "typist" but the product, business or service is different in each case.
263. Ask: "Who does this person work for or Where does this person work?"
264. Enter the name of the company, firm or organization for which he/she works.
265. Some large companies make, produce or sell more than one kind of product and the same is true of large departments of Government. In such cases state the branch or section for which the person works.
266. If the person is self-employed, or works in a family business or has done other work, ask,
"What is this person's trade or business?"

Write in two or three words what kind of business or activity is carried on - what is made or produced - what services are provided - what goods are sold- what crops are grown.

Be precise. Avoid vague answers. Examples of good answers are:

- shoe repair
- making furniture
- bus company
- retail store

Examples of bad answers are:

- repair
- factory

- business
- private enterprise
- self-employed

267. We must know what is repaired, what the factory makes, what kind of business, what sort of private enterprise, what the self employed person makes or sells.

268. Ask: "How many hours were spent on that work last week?"

269. There are 5 possible categories. Encircle one of these.

270. If the person answers "NO", to question 45, encircle NO. 2 and go to the next question (Question 46).

Question 46 - Traditional kind of Work Last Week for Sale or Money

271. You must also find out from those who did work last week whether he/she did any traditional kind of work last week, for sale or worked to produce something intended for sale.

This will include persons engaged in fishing, collection, toddy making, drying/salting fish, growing crops, cooking food, raising poultry, making thatch or handicraft for sale.

272. For example, a market vendor is paid for the food sold. The same is true of people who catch fish, raise livestock, grow root vegetables to sell.

273. If the person answers "YES", encircle No 1.

274. Then find out more about the kind of work and enter the details in the space provided. We require an exact description of the Work the person did. It is sometimes difficult to get an exact answer but you should always aim to provide a two or three word description of the person's job. A vague single word description is not enough.

275. You will then ask the person to tell you how many hours he/she worked during the last week doing that work. There are 5 possible categories. Encircle one of these.

276. If the person answers "NO", to question 46, encircle NO. 2 and go to the next question (Question 47).

Question 47 - Traditional kind of Work Last Week for own/family use.

277. You must also find out from those who did work last week whether he/she did any traditional kind of work last week, or produced something for their own or family use, and not for sale. It also include women engaged in housework or domestic duties

278. This will include persons engaged in fishing, collection, toddy making, drying/salting fish, growing crops, cooking food, housework/domestic duties, raising poultry, making thatch or handicraft for subsistence or for family use.

279. For example, a man may catch fish to feed his family; a woman may make mats for her house or grow taro for her family's use, or clean the house, wash clothes for her family.

280. If the person answers "YES", encircle No 1.

281. Then find out more about the kind of work and enter the details in the space provided. We require an exact description of the Work the person did. It is sometimes difficult to get an exact answer but you should always aim to provide a two or three word description of the person's job. A vague single word description is not enough.

282. You will then ask the person to tell you how many hours he/she worked during the last week doing that work. There are 5 possible categories. Encircle one of these categories.

283. If the person answers "NO", to question 47, encircle NO. 2.

Question 48 - Reason for not working last week.

284. Persons who did not work last week and for whom you entered "No" to Question 44 must answer Question 48. In other words you only put this question to people who are unemployed, or to those who did less than one hour's work last week.

285. Ask: "Why this person did not work last week?"

286. There are many reasons why a person may have done no work last week. Those which are most important to the census are:

1. Student: The person did not work because he or she was at school, college or University, or attending a training course which has a total length of more than 6 weeks. Full time students on holiday at the time of the census who may have worked for at least one hour last week should not be entered as "Student".

2. Too Old: This person is too old to work. Only enter the person in this category if the person is over 50 years and does not plan to work any more.

3. Looking for work: This applies to people who would have worked, who wanted to work and who actively looked for work last week. He/she might have gone round asking people to give/her a job. He/she might have applied for a job and was waiting to hear the results of his/her application. He/she might be wanting to have a job, but there were no employment vacancies in his/her village or town. The test is 'Did this person do anything about finding work?'.

4. Did not want to work: This category applies to those of working age (15-55 years) who were capable of working but who did not work last week and did nothing about finding work, either because they knew there were no jobs available or because they did not want to work. Such a person did nothing last week, and was dependent upon others for food and shelter. The test is 'Did this person do anything to provide for himself or herself?'

5. Handicapped/Disabled: If the person is permanently handicapped and cannot work, place him in this category. But remember that some handicapped person are able to do various tasks in the house or garden, and some may even hold paid jobs; if this is the case, they should not be included here.

6. Other: There are other reasons why a person may have done no work last week. Ask and record the reason, and encircle No. 7. Some examples are - people on leave, too ill to work, patient in hospital.

287. THE NEXT 2 QUESTIONS (A) AND (B) SHOULD BE PUT ONLY TO THOSE WHO ANSWERED QUESTION 48 AND STATED THAT THEY WERE LOOKING FOR WORK (NO. 3). THERE ARE 2 QUESTIONS FOR THESE PERSONS, AND BOTH ARE SURROUNDED IN A BOX.

288. Ask, "Did this person ever had paid employment before?" If the answer is "YES", encircle No. 1, and then ask the next question. "Is this person looking for a first job?" Encircle the appropriate answer.

289. If the answer to the first question is "NO", encircle No. 2, and then ask the next question: "Is this person looking for a first job?" Encircle the appropriate answer.

290. This ends the questions on economic activity.

FOR ALL MEN AND BOYS, AND ALL FEMALES UNDER 15, YOU SHOULD STOP THE INTERVIEW AT THIS POINT. ONLY CONTINUE TO THE NEXT QUESTION IF THE PERSON IS A FEMALE 15 YEARS AND OVER I.E. THOSE BORN IN 1976 OR BEFORE.

291. An answer is required of all women in this category whether or not they are married, whether or not they are still attending school, and whether or not you think they may have borne children.
292. Some households may have more than one woman in this category. Make sure you collect the information for each woman who is 15 years or older.
293. First explain to the woman you are interviewing, and to the other people who may be listening, that you want to ask some questions about the number of children she has had. (This information is required for estimating population growth in Neighbors. It will also help the Ministry of Health to plan and improve the health services in the country)
294. If possible, speak to the woman herself. She will know about the children she has borne and will be able to answer the questions more accurately than anyone else.
295. The census is concerned with all the children a woman has borne, including children who have grown up and left home, children borne by the woman to other men as well as to her present husband, her children who are living away from home and the children who have died even if they died shortly after birth. Be careful to include all young babies.
296. Do not include adopted children, step children or children who may be staying in the household but were not borne by the woman herself.
297. We are concerned with the number of children the woman has borne alive. If the number in any of the Boxes is '0' then write '00'. Do not leave the Boxes blank.
298. A child born alive is one who cries after being born. The Census is concerned with children born alive. Do not include still-births- that is children born dead- who did not cry.
299. When you are ready tell the woman or girl that you want to ask about all the children she has given birth to, including those that have died since birth.

Question 49- Live born children

300. Ask: "Has this woman borne any live born children?"
301. If she answers "Yes", encircle No. 1, and go on to the next question (Q. 50)
- If she answers "No", encircle No. 2, and STOP THE INTERVIEW.

Question 50 - Number of live born children

302. If the woman has borne a child or children, ask: "How many children has this woman borne alive?"
303. Write the number of male and female children in the appropriate Boxes in Question 50. If the answer is none for either male or female children write "00" in the appropriate Box. Remind her to include her own children that have been adopted by other people, and children that have already grown up, and any children that have died.

Question 51 - Number of live born children present

304. Ask: "How many were here on Census Night?"

305. Write the number of male and female children who were in the household on census night in the appropriate Boxes in Question 51. If the answer is 'none' for either male or female children write "00" in the appropriate Box.

Question 52 - Number of live born children away

306. Ask: "How many were elsewhere on census night?".

307. Write the number of male and female children who were not in the household, but away, on census night in the appropriate Boxes in Question 52. If the answer is none for either male or female children write "00" in the appropriate Box.

Question 53 - Number of live born children that have died

308. Ask: "How many have died?"

309. Write the number of male and female children the woman has borne alive but who have died since. If the answer is 'none' write "00" in the appropriate box.

310. You have recorded details of all the children the woman has borne alive. You are next required to record particulars of her most recent live birth- that is of the last child she has borne alive. It does not matter whether the child has since died.

Question 54 - Date of birth of last live born child

311. Ask: "When was the last child born?"

312. Whenever possible record the day, month and year in the Box provided.

313. If the day is not known, record at least the month and year, even if it takes time to find out this information.
